## DIRECTOR'S REPORT

As we reflect on the academic session 2025–26, I am pleased to present the Annual Report of NLK Vidya Mandir Inter College, highlighting our journey of progress, challenges, and collective achievements.

From an academic perspective, the year has offered us both achievements to celebrate and challenges to address with greater intent. Our State Board Grade 10 results remained steady with a school aggregate of 77%, reflecting commendable student performance and consistency across major subjects. Grade 12 students also delivered encouraging results in several areas, particularly in Computer Applications and a few core subjects. However, our internal academic review has identified certain priority areas that present valuable opportunities for further strengthening student learning outcomes. The analysis indicates that additional academic support would be beneficial for students in Grades 9 and 11, particularly in Mathematics and Science-related subjects, to ensure a smoother transition into higher classes and enhanced conceptual understanding.

Accordingly, the school has formulated a focused action plan that includes strengthened remediation programmes, targeted mentoring, subject-specific academic support, regular performance tracking, and enhanced teacher capacity-building initiatives. These measures are aimed at providing timely interventions, improving classroom practices, and enabling students to achieve their full academic potential.

In Beyond Academics, our students continued to excel across multiple domains. Participation and achievements in events such as the Kanpur Youth Olympics, STEAM Quiz

Competitions, HCL Humming Bird, Inclusion Fest, Abacus Competition Festival, and IIT Madras skill-based certification programmes reflect our growing emphasis on exposure-driven learning and talent development. Our students brought laurels to the institution through achievements in athletics, boxing, cricket, karate, judo, art, quizzes, and scholarship-based recognitions.

The school also strengthened its focus on student leadership and life skills through an active Student Council, inter-branch competitions, public speaking forums, and structured programmes aimed at personality development.

Through initiatives such as the STEAM Programme, Reading Programme, Student Advancement Programme, Career Talk 2.0, psychometric orientation, and skill certification opportunities, we have consciously worked towards preparing students for an evolving academic and professional landscape. ## Beyond Classroom Learning Activities

### SESSION ON HEALTH EDUCATION – BY DR. RAHUL MEHRA

We had the privilege of conducting an insightful session with Dr. Rahul Mehra, the Founder and Executive Chairman of Tarang Health Alliance and India's National Representative to the UNESCO Chair for Global Health & Education. A visionary leader with a PhD in Biomedical Engineering from New York University and over 70 patents to his name, Dr. Mehra has dedicated his work to transforming school health education across India. During our session, he shared his inspiring journey of creating the Comprehensive School Health Program (CSHP), which empowers students with essential health knowledge.



### BE CLEAN, BE HEALTHY, BE HAPPY

The Health and Hygiene Activity aimed to create awareness among children about cleanliness and healthy habits. Students learned essential practices like regular handwashing, proper use of tissues, and keeping their surroundings clean. Teachers demonstrated hygiene routines and explained how they help prevent diseases. Interactive activities such as role play and rhymes made the session engaging. 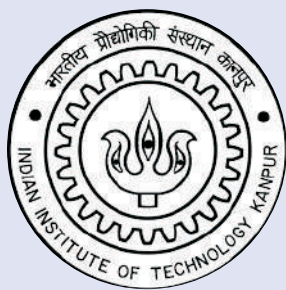
### DIWALI ABILIVERSE 3.0 & INCLUSION FEST

## Government School's Report

### **PURNA DEVI KHANNA GIRLS INTER COLLEGE (GRADE 6 TO 12)**

Purna Devi Khanna Girls Inter College was established in the year 1956. The school offers education from Class 6 to Class 12 for Science and Arts streams.

According to available records, during the 1991-92 academic session, the school had 3,500 students and 67 teachers. However, due to changing government policies, lack of facilities, dilapidated school buildings, and inadequate basic resources, the number of both students and teachers has been steadily declining over the years.

As a result, at present, the school has only 497 enrolled students, of whom 183 are in the Science stream, 23 are in the Commerce stream and 208 are in the Arts stream. A total of 24 teachers are currently working in the institution.



### **SHRI HIRALAL KHANNA VIDHYA MANDIR (GRADE 6 TO 12)**



It is worth noting that Hira Lal Khanna Inter College, Jawahar Nagar, Kanpur was established in the year 1945. The school provides education to students from Class 6 to Class 12 (Boys Section). The academic streams offered at the school include Science, Arts, and Commerce.

According to available records, in 1989 the school had 1,539 students enrolled and 65 teachers working. However, due to government policies, lack of facilities, dilapidated school buildings, and insufficient basic resources, the number of both students and teachers has been steadily declining.

As a result, at present, the school has only 86 enrolled students, including 22 in the Science stream, 12 in the Arts stream, and 9 in the Commerce stream. The school currently has 13 teachers.

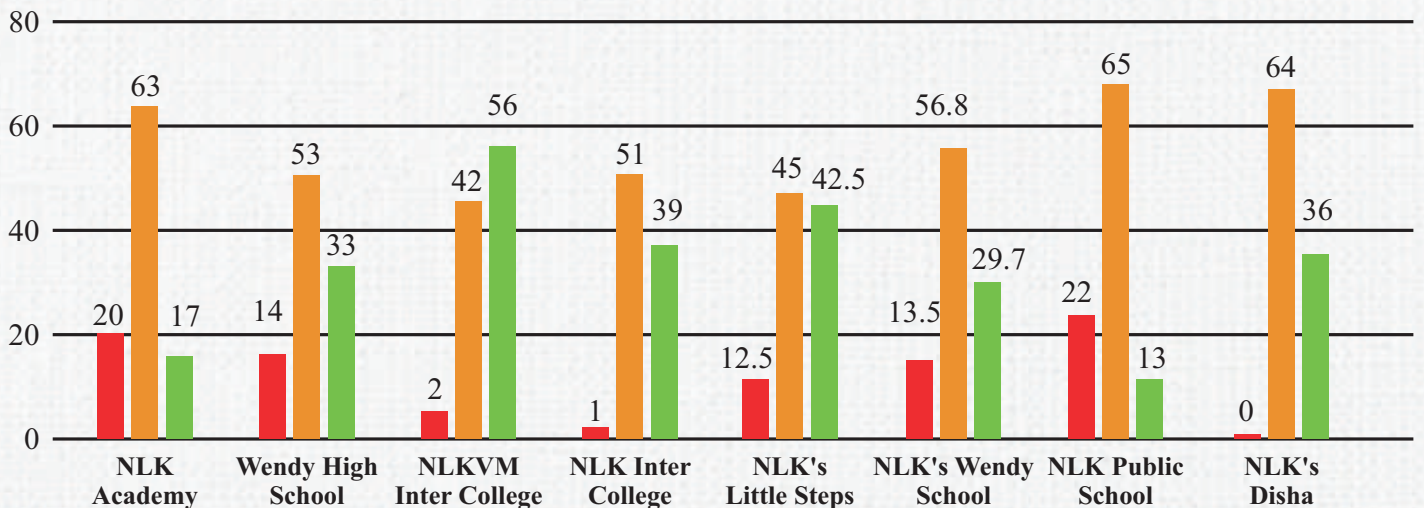


## PERFORMANCE EVALUATION REPORT

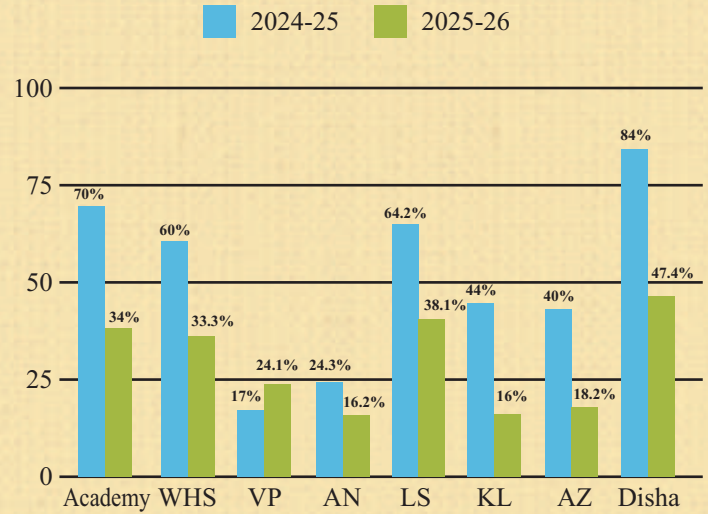


## Teacher Attendance Analysis 2025-26

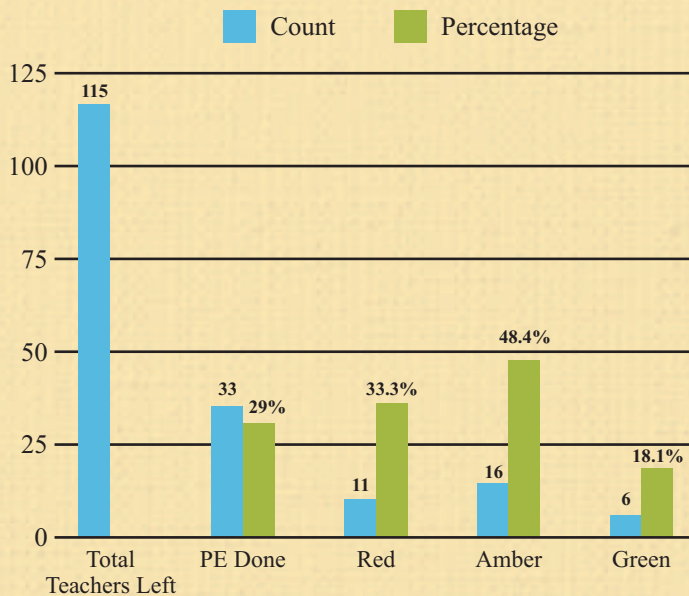


## Attrition Percentage

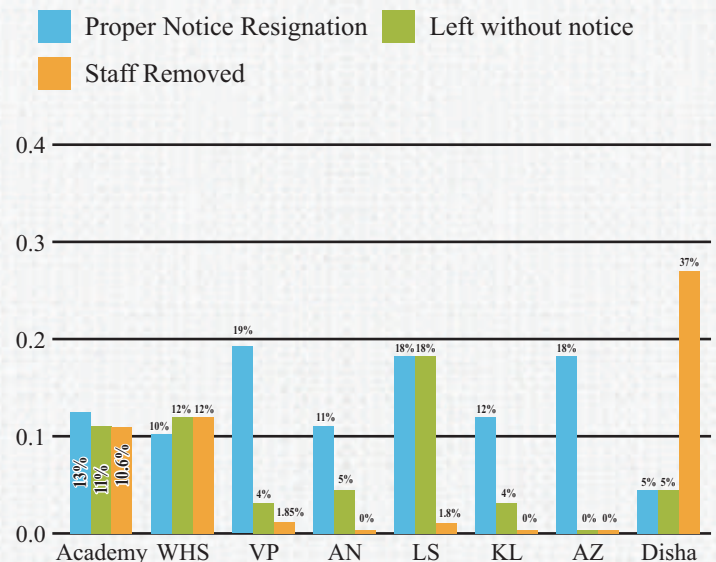

## Teachers who left 2025-26: RAG Score

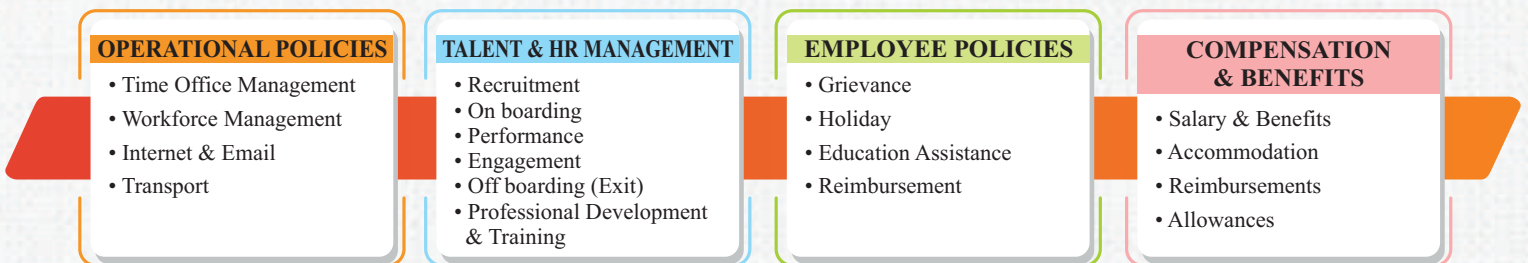


## Staff Left Percentage Analysis 2025-26

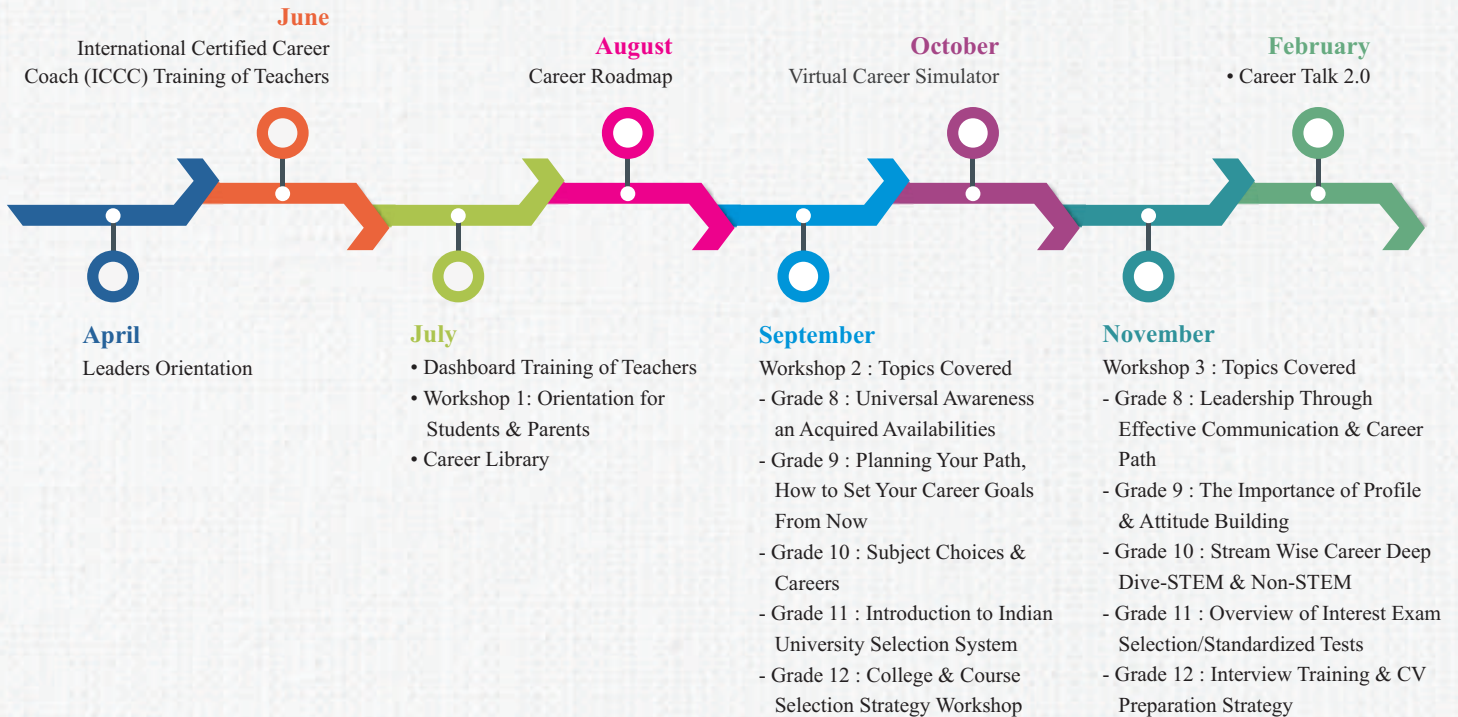

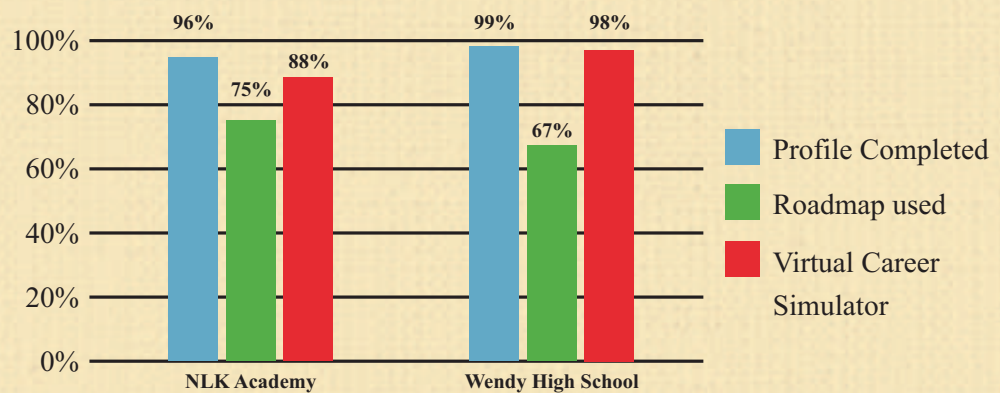
